AUTOMATIC RESERVATIONS: If you had a table at the 2024 Show, you have an automatic reservation for the same table in 2025, but THIS RESERVATION EXPIRES DECEMBER 15, 2024. You may still apply for a table after this date, but we cannot guarantee a table after December 15. NO RESERVATIONS HONORED OR APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED WITHOUT FULL PAYMENT! Note to NEW exhibitors: your table(s) will be assigned after 12/15/2024. If you are adding an additional table that you did not previously hold, your location may be moved depending on the availability of the table next to you.

ALL TABLE-HOLDERS AND VISITORS agree to abide by the OKCA Show rules and to hold the OKCA, its officers, and the Lane Events Center harmless for any accident, loss, damage, theft, or injury.

ANY QUESTION OR DISPUTE arising during the Show shall be resolved by the Show Chair, whose decision shall be final.

THIS IS A KNIFE SHOW. All tables must be 90% knives or knife related items (e.g. swords, axes, edged tools, edged weapons, knife books, knifemaking supplies). If in doubt, check with the Show Chair ahead of time. The OKCA reserves the right to bar any item from display or sale. No firearms may be sold or shown at this Show.

ALL EXHIBITORS are required to keep their tables set up throughout the public hours of the Show: 8 AM Saturday to 3 PM Sunday. ANY EXHIBITOR WHO LEAVES OR COVERS THEIR TABLE BEFORE 3 PM SUNDAY FORFEITS FUTURE RESERVATIONS AND WILL BE DENIED TABLES AT FUTURE OREGON KNIFE SHOWS. EXHIBITOR TABLES ARE TO BE PACKED UP AND OUT OF THE BUILDING BY 5PM SUNDAY.

DISPLAY TABLES will be around the perimeter of the room. Displays are eligible for display awards, which are hand-made knives donated by members and supporters of OKCA. Display judging will be by rules established by OKCA. Special category awards may also be offered. NOTHING MAY BE SOLD FROM DISPLAY TABLES.

SALE/TRADE TABLES Sharing of tables will not be allowed. Exhibitors must comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws. Oregon has NO SALES TAX.

BADGES: Each table-holder is entitled to one additional Show badge. NO EXCEPTIONS.

LICENSED SERVICE ANIMALS ONLY: Unlicensed service animals or pets are not permitted in the buildings of the Lane County fairgrounds and will be asked by the fairgrounds administration to leave the premises.

KNIFEMAKERS who are present and are table-holders at this Show may enter knives in the knifemaking award competition.

FOR MORE INFORMATION on categories and judging criteria in the display and hand-made knife competitions, contact the Club.

SHOW FACILITATORS will be provided by OKCA from 9AM Friday until 4 PM Sunday. However, exhibitors are responsible for watching their own tables. Neither the OKCA nor the Lane Events Center will be responsible for any loss, theft, damage, or injury of any kind.

CITY AND COUNTY REGULATIONS require that there be: • No Smoking within the Exhibit Hall at any time; •No alcoholic beverages consumed within the Exhibit Hall during the public hours of the Show; •No loaded firearms worn or displayed at the Show; •No swords or knives brandished or displayed in a provocative manner.•All blades must have their tips/points facing away from the aisle.

NOTE ON SWITCHBLADES AND DAGGERS: In Oregon it is legal to make, sell, buy, or own switchblade knives. However, it is ILLEGAL to carry a switchblade knife, a gravity knife, a dagger, or a dirk concealed on one's person, or for a convicted felon to possess a switchblade or gravity knife. Most other states have banned switchblade knives. Under federal law, it is ILLEGAL to mail, carry, or ship a switchblade or gravity knife across state lines. The Oregon Knife Collectors Association is not responsible for force majeure.

"What IS IT?" - More appropriately, "What WAS IT?" By Martin Drivdahl

Only the riveted together coined metal handles remain of what must have once been an exquisitely made and very well loved easy opening commemorative pen knife. A small drill hole through the





salvaged remnants suggests that a thong or small chain may have once been attached so the piece could serve as a fob. Research unearthed some interesting historical facts in regard to the highly detailed impressions and words stamped on the two old knife scales. These pieces are 3 %" long and on one is depicted a man's bust within a raised oval. On the other is a village scene within another raised oval. All words are legible and are in German. The bust is that of Thomas Koschat (lived 1845 to 1914) who was a famous Austrian

opera singer and composer. From 1877 to 1906 Thomas Koschat founded and sang with the Koschat Quintet, touring Europe and America extensively. The words "Karntner Leiderfurst" above

the coined bust translates to "Austria's men's choir".

The words "Verlassen bin i" between the bust and harp is the song title of a notable composition by Koschat that translates to "I am leaving". This tune was found on an early Victor record as well as on an old music box. The word "Koschat' s Geburtsort" appearing to the left of the village scene

translates to "Koschat's place of birth". The village name "Viktring" is on the right and below it the word "Karnten" is the old German word for the area that is Austria. The maker of the knife as well as who were it's previous owners remains a mystery.

Stag English Self Defence Folding Knife By B K Brooks

My interest in Sheffield and English knives was started by those two Zalensky Boys who have led me down an expensive side road of knife collecting. This particular knife I am writing about I solely blame on Garry Zalensky who got me interested in a style of English made folding knives which are variously described as English Jacks, folding dirks, Self

Defence knives or just damn folders. Per our Bernard own Levine's Guide to Knives and their Values on page

212 English Jacks are Americanised name applied to these large sized, slim, regular and sleeveboard jack knives commonly with locking master blades. Bernard notes the "English Jack is less bulky and more pocketable than clasp or folding hunters, but its master blade is almost as long as theirs are". My particular knife I am discussing stretches the size of one's pocket though.

These knives were produced possibly during the 1700's but mainly in the 1800's appealing to the well heeled travelers who were on the open roads of England whether by foot, horse or on stage, Crimes committed Highwaymen on these roads was well documented with such names as Tom, Dick and Harry Dunsdon, Claude Du Vall (the Gallant Highwayman), Richard Turpin, Louis Jeremiah Abershawe (Last executed highwayman to have his body put on public display in England), even one

Lady Katherine Ferrers, who was an English gentlewoman/heiress and a Miss named Mary Byrant.

While most of the above listed highwaymen (and women) were armed with pistols at the time, they were single shot, unreliable, and the garden variety highwaymen worked in groups

defense knives and I was a bit worried about it. It was marked JAMES MARSH but the MARSH on the tang was offset. Everything else seemed correct, but I am always leerie of fakes. After asking questions, assured it was not loose as a goose, and that the fabulous stag had no damage or repair I finally put in a low ball bid. It was immediately accepted which worried me even more. I expected a counter-offer!

United Arriving from the Kingdom I was much relieved it was not some India or Pakistan copy. I sent pictures to Garry who admitted not only the real thing but an inch bigger than his biggest, a Hobson, mine being 19 inches open.

The stag handle was of course its high light, fitted like a glove and in perfect condition. Garry waxed poetic

artificial lighting

noting it amazing these knives produced no electricity, no

but

sunlight, no electric power tools but just water powered devices and hand tools. But Garry could not explain the offset MARSH on the tang under JAMES. So Garry referred me to his son Mark.

Mark quickly made the call. Next to the MARSH was a good blob of tarnish and wear. Mark said it was a JAMES TIDMARSH knife. He



with clubs, small swords, axes and of course knives. Hence if a skirmish started and pistol shots expended, knives came out on both sides. The English travelers preferred a long dangerous knife and these slim folding knives made them not so obvious in public.

This particular knife came up on eBay, was a giant among self

also asked if the word BEST was on it and there it was just a faint marking above the name. Mark admitted not much is known about the maker (I had found nothing in the books I have). After more than a few hours on the Web I came up with some scraps of info.

Some refer to James Tidmarsh as a Sheffield maker (without proof), yet other information points to London. It appears Tidmark may have been involved in a multiple production of cutlery, pens and steel combs. There is a warehouse in London with James Tidmark listed as resident.

Web pictures show a Gun/knife marked James Tidmark, as well as

a few Hobo or slot knives with spoon or fork. No city or country names on tang marks of the few knives pictured. Some suggest Tidmark has been around in the early 1800's but other information suggests

activity more around mid 1800's. The name seems to have a connection with Excelsior branding and apparently a company called Thomas Ellin & Co used the name JamesTidmark on some of their knives (buyout??)

Well it is one whale of a self defense knife and the stag handle size is indeed a rarity. Please note the pictures. The stag makes it really show well, and the craftsmanship is tight as a clock. If anyone else has a James Tidmark

product or any information on him I would love to be clued in.
